4th ANNUAL DORSET HOLIDAY TRACTOR PARADE


The parade is held the day after Thanksgiving; the route runs from HN Williams to the Town Green.



#### **Arthur Jones at Dorset Library in August**




Son of a farmer and housewife who lived at the top of Dorset's Nichols Hill Road, he still lives nearby.



By his early teens, sketching and watercolor painting were Arthur's constant occupations. His father-told "I can't get milk out of that cow"-always encouraged his art work, even moved a small building from East Dorset to Nichols Hill so Arthur would keep his paints out of the living room. In that 12 x 12-ft. workspace he had a little wiring and some heat as well as a bit of furniture. Later, when people came to look at his paintings,

he'd move the furniture out so they could get inside.

The Jones show at the library will extend through the month of August. For more information, you may







#### OWLS HEAD TOWN FOREST PROJECT RECEIVES PARTIAL FUNDING!

This summer the Town of Dorset/ Conservation Commission received a grant from the Vermont Housing & Conservation Board and the United States Forest Community Forest Program. The grants total nearly \$400,000 and will help with the potential purchase of the Gettysburg Quarry property in an effort to expand the Owls Head Town Forest.

This project is vital to keeping public access to Owls head open and available. The project will also help to preserve public access to Gettysburg Quarry. The remainder of the funds needed to purchase the property will come from private donations given by the community. Fundraising events will be listed in the near future.
