Zoning Administrator Notes:

Many people use winter as a time for planning spring projects. It is not too early to be thinking about obtaining a zoning permit for work that will begin in 2012. An applicant has up to one year to begin a project after a permit is issued. Obtaining a permit early allows work to begin as soon as weather breaks. It also allows time for any required hearings before the Planning Commission and, or the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

When filling out an application for a zoning permit, be sure to follow the directions included with the application. Double check to be certain all parts of the form have been completed. One of the most common reasons a permit is delayed is that the application is incomplete. Nearly all applications require a Plot Plan drawn to scale. The Zoning Administrator can provide a copy of the tax map for your property which can be used to create this.

If the project includes the addition of one or more bedrooms, a permit from the VT Dept. of Environmental Conservation Wastewater Management Division is also required prior to a zoning application being reviewed and approved. The Rutland Regional Office can provide guidance and address questions you may have. They can be contacted at 802-786-5900. Please provide a copy of your wastewater permit with your zoning application.

Applicants for commercial projects should contact the VT Dept. of Fire Safety prior to submitting a zoning application. A State building permit or change of use permit is typically required of all commercial projects. The Rutland office can be reached at 802-786-5867

WINTER DRIVING TIPS:



Start with the basics: Have good snow tires, traction strips, a shovel, working heat and defrosters, new wipers, and plenty of washer fluid – carry extra.

Clean up your act: Clear all snow and ice from windows, mirrors, lights, hood, trunk, and roof. You need to see and be seen.

Take your time: You will need extra time on winter roads – relax, don't rush or speed. Travel during daylight whenever possible.

Safety first: Keep an emergency kit with blankets, flashlight, batteries, warm clothes, booster cables, a candle, and matches in your vehicle.

Speed: Slow down and drive according to the road conditions. Driving too fast is the leading cause of winter crashes.

Distance: Leave more room than usual between vehicles – you'll need the extra time to brake safely. Signal early, merge slowly and carefully.

Brake: Brake early and slowly to prevent skidding. Never slam on the brakes on winter roads.

Control: Do not use cruise control during a storm, don't overestimate the ability of four-wheel drive and lookout for black ice on what appears to be bare pavement.

Focus: Stay off the cell phone and minimize other distractions. You'll need added reaction time in case something happens.
